

Fall-tastic!

a Saturday, Nov. 11, the St. David's Country Club in Wayne will play host to Tredyffrin & Eastfown Care's 10th annual Fall Fest, featuring dinner, duncing and a silent suction. Fall Fest is T&E Care's premier event, naising about 30 percent of the organization's annual budget. Approximately 96 percent of the monites raised go toward assisting families in need in the Tredyffrin and Eastfown communities.

T&E Care was established in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. The group's first mission was to provide aid to families affected by the hurricane who had relocated to the Tredyffrin area.

Throughout the fall of 2005, the volunteers of T&E Care worked together and pooled their resources to help the displaced families do everything from find their way around the area to furnishing their new, permanent residences.

The organization, founded by Kirk and Sandy Gorman, collected donations of all kinds for the New Orleans families, from computers to clothing, home furnishings and other household items. The group expanded its mission over the holidays that same year, helping families in need of assistance after difficult life events like divorce, illness, and even a fire. They provided gift cards and basic necessities, but they also offered the families medical and educational resources, and helped to connect the ones who needed it to employment.

By the time the families affected by Katrina had moved on, the group had been inundated with donations from all over the Tredyffrin and Easttown communities. Realizing they were a powerful force for good in their neighborhoods, T&E Care decided to keep moving forward and helping those in need.

In May of 2006, T&E Care was given permanent nonprofit status, and its founding board of directors decided the organization would remain all-volunteer so the monies earned by the group would go directly toward helping families in need in their community. The group says it has helped hundreds of families since its inception, providing emergency assistance with rent, utility bills, clothes, toys, or computers. Though not a means of long-term support, the organization will work to get families through a difficult time.

The families helped by T&E Care are mainly there by referral from places such as local faith-based organizations, counselors, or schools, and, on occasion, they approach the group directly. No matter where they come from, each request is vetted so the group knows it's legitimate.

Some of the organization's signature programs include assistance with summer camps, transportation, school meals, and college and textbooks. Annually, it hosts a holiday drive, a kids' clothing event, a school supply drive, and Computers for Kids.

With such a significant portion of the organization's budget being raised during the November event, the group goes all-out to make it special. "T&E Care Supports Everyday

Programs That Address Today's Needs Today

- Home & Hearth Program that provides housing assistance, utilities, and general food and clothing needs. Additionally the Home & Hearth Program encompasses the Kids Clothing Event, an annual spring clothing drive; School Lunch Program, offering ongoing support for lunch assistance to area students; and a "Stuff Program," which assists families in need of basic housewares and furniture.
- · Transportation Assistance Program
- Holiday Gifts and Special Meals Program

- College Assistance Program for tuition and book assistance, mentoring and general guidance
- Summer Camp Program, which helps with tuition for summer camps
- School Supplies Program
- Computers for Students, which provides refurbished computers to local families and students, while giving new laptops to qualifying college students
- · Resume/Job Interview Preparation
- Budgeting Assistance
