- Your name
- Your hero's name (if you are submitting a group, then just include the generic or specific name of the group)
- Your relationship to this person/group
- One sentence why this person/group is your hero.

- If you have a picture of your hero – feel free to attach it

Please note: We will not be separately contacting your Everyday Hero prior to the event. If you choose to let him/her/them know about this submission – that's totally up to you.
